Short-Acting Beta-2 Agonists Limits

The increased utilization of short-acting beta-2 agonists (SABA's) has been associated with worsening asthma symptoms and an increased risk of death (see footnote 1). The excessive, uncontrolled use of drugs in this class contribute to the increasing rates in asthma mortality seen in most countries. International consensus guidelines now generally recommend using short-acting beta-2 agonists only for the relief of symptoms, on an as-needed basis (see footnote 2). Florida Medicaid has instituted limits on the number of SABA's that a recipient may receive during one month. We encourage providers to speak with recipients regarding the proper use of short-acting beta-2 agonists for asthma.
