The Department is comprised of three interrelated Divisions that work closely together toward the goal of social responsibility in Medicine: Family Medicine, Policy and Community Development, and Medicine and Society.

The faculty will be a member of a team developing groundbreaking, innovative approaches to medical education and clinical activities focused on the needs of South Florida's culturally diverse, medically underserved communities. Our aim is to graduate culturally competent, social responsible physicians and to simultaneously provide service to medical underserved populations. The primary responsibility will be supervising medical students and residents in the longitudinal Green Family Foundation Medicine and Society/Family Medicine curriculum, a unique educational model that reflects a collaborative, interprofessional approach to educating future physicians.
