FAFP FAMILY PHYSICIAN OF THE YEAR 2021

TERRY HASHEY DO, MHSE, FAAFP

The FAFP Family Physician of the Year award is provided in recognition of outstanding performance as a Family Physician and in dedication to the profession and service to the patient. This year's award is presented to **Terry Hashey, DO, MHSE, FAAFP**, of Jacksonville, FL.

Dr. Terry Hashey trained at the Mayo Clinic Jacksonville in the Family Medicine Department. Prior to that he completed medical school at the University of North Texas Health Science Center/Texas College of Osteopathic Medicine. He trained as a Health Educator, receiving his Master's Degree in Health Science Education (MHSE) from the University of Florida and earned his Certification as a Health Education Specialist (CHES).

Dr. Hashey has proudly served for over thirty years in the U.S. Coast Guard Reserve, Texas Army National Guard, the U.S. Army Reserve and the Florida Army National Guard. He is presently assigned as the Assistant State Surgeon and State Flight Surgeon for the Florida Army National Guard. Dr. Hashey completed the Army Flight Surgeon Course, Combat Casualty Care Course, Captains Career Course, Brigade Surgeon Course, and Command and General Officer Staff Course.

He is active in his community, having served as the Young Physician Member of the Duval County Medical Society Board of Directors and the Florida Young Physician Representative to the American Academy of Family Physicians. He is a Cub Scout Den Leader and a Boy Scout Assistant Scoutmaster. COL Hashey served as President of the National Guard Association of Florida.

Dr Hashey is a proud father of four great kids and a humble husband to an amazing wife. They love fishing, running, biking, camping, and swimming.



FAFP FAMILY PHYSICIAN EXECUTIVE 2021

MARGARET CROSSMAN, MD, FAAFP

The FAFP Family Physician Executive award was created to recognize an outstanding family physician for his or her role as a physician executive. This award is reserved for Florida Academy members whose executive skills in health care organizations have contributed to excellence in the provision of high-quality health care, and demonstrated that family physicians can have an impact on improving the overall health of the nation. This award is to recognize exceptional leadership by a full-time family physician executive. This year, the FAFP Family Physician Executive Award goes to Margaret Crossman, MD, FAAFP, of New Smyrna Beach, FL.

Dr. Margaret Crossman is the Senior Vice President and Chief Medical Officer for Halifax Health and serves as the liaison with the physicians on the medical staff. She is Board Certified and a Fellow of the American Academy of Family Practice, and holds an Associate Professor of Medicine position through Florida State University College of Medicine.

Dr Crossman's experience includes over 25 years of practicing full spectrum Family Medicine, including pediatric, obstetric and gynecologic care. Her roles at Halifax Health have included serving as Faculty and Women's Health Coordinator for the Family Medicine Residency Program (FMRP), directing the FMRP Annual Family Medicine Update Conference, and serving as a core team member for the Women and Infant Health MORE (Managing Obstetrical Risk Efficiently) patient safety initiative that paved the way for Halifax to become a Perinatal Center of Excellence. Dr. Crossman has served as team lead with national Process Improvement initiatives including chronic disease management, and various women's health topics.

In her current role as Chief Medical Officer, Dr. Crossman oversees the effective management of Credentialing and Medical Staff Services to ensure patients receive the highest standard of medical care. She also chairs the Governance Council for Halifax's employed physician group, Halifax Health Care Partners (HHCP), and remains clinically active in both the inpatient and outpatient settings through her part-time faculty role with the FMRP.



FAFP EXCELLENCE IN ADVOCACY AWARD 2021

Julia Jenkins, MD, FAAFP

The FAFP Excellence in Advocacy Award honors and officially recognizes an individual, or individuals, for outstanding work in political advocacy at the local, state, or national level which advances the FAFP's mission to Support Florida's Family Physicians. This year's award is presented to **Julia Jenkins**, **MD**, **FAAFP**, of Clearwater, FL.

Dr. Julia Jenkins has been employed by BayCare in the Tampa Bay area since 2008. After obtaining her medical degree from the University of South Florida, Dr. Jenkins completed her residency at Bayfront Medical Center. In 2016 she left her outpatient practice in Palm Harbor to become a full-time faculty physician at the USF-MPM Family Medicine Residency Program in Clearwater. Dr. Jenkins was awarded the Degree of Fellow from the American Academy of Family Physicians, and she completed a Faculty Development Fellowship at the University of North Carolina. Her main academic interests include telemedicine, cardiovascular disease, nutrition and lifestyle medicine, POCUS, home visits, ophthalmology, and advocacy.

Dr. Jenkins believes that every family physician has an obligation to advocate for vulnerable patients and for the specialty of Family Medicine. She has routinely participated in the Doctor of the Day program and has been active in numerous FAFP committees and activities. As a speaker for a series of FAFP webinars in 2020, she taught virtual patient care skills to Florida family physicians new to the field of telemedicine, and she has given similar talks nationally. Dr. Jenkins currently serves as Chair of the AAFP Telehealth Member Interest Group and as Chair of the FAFP Continuing Professional Development Committee, where she enjoys collaborating with her family physician colleagues to provide practice-changing educational offerings and resources. She is a proud LEO wife, mother of twin boys, and lifelong Gator fan.



FAFP FULL-TIME EDUCATOR 2021

Frederick Anderson, MD

The FAFP Exemplary Full-Time Educator of the Year award is provided in recognition of dedication, expertise and ability to provide the highest quality instruction to physicians in all phases of their medical training and practice in a full-time capacity. This year's award is provided to **Frederick Anderson**, **MD** of Southwest Ranches, FL.

As medical director for the Department of Humanities, Health, and Society, Dr. Frederick Anderson oversees clinical care provided by the Green Family Foundation Neighborhood Health Education Learning Program (NeighborhoodHELP). He also teaches HWCOM medical students at all levels as well as residents enrolled in the West Kendall Baptist Hospital-Florida International University Family Medicine Residency.

Dr. Anderson's projects and scholarship efforts include incorporating social determinants of health into the medical care plan, integrating behavioral health with primary care, and using telehealth and health information technology to improve care for underserved populations. He has been the principal investigator for numerous grants to support clinical services and publishes to disseminate lessons learned from NeighborhoodHELP.

Dr. Anderson is an Albert Schweitzer Fellowship recipient and former National Health Service Corps participant. His passion is to care for and promote health equity for underserved individuals and families in NeighborhoodHELP.



FAFP YOUNG LEADER 2021

Maria Stevens, MD

The FAFP Young Leader award is provided in recognition of outstanding service to the Florida Academy of Family Physicians and the specialty of Family Medicine by a young physician. This year's award is provided to **Maria Stevens, MD**, of Miami, FL.

Maria Stevens, MD is an Assistant Professor in the Division of Family and Community Medicine in the Department of Humanities, Health, and Society and Course Director of the Clinical Medicine courses in the first and second year at FIU HWCOM. She received her medical degree from Virginia Commonwealth University and completed her residency training in Family Medicine at Bon Secours St. Francis Hospital in Richmond, Virginia.

Since joining FIU as faculty in 2017, Dr. Stevens has focused on teaching, advising and mentoring medical students at all stages of their training. She is involved in simulation-based education, curriculum development, and assessment. Her work has been recognized and reflected in her many accomplishments including the 2020 HWCOM Excellence in Teaching Award for Small Group Instruction and 2019 South Florida's Top Black Educators Award.

Dr. Stevens is passionate about providing care to the underserved and has advocated for the rights of women, underrepresented minority groups, and persons with disabilities. Her interests include incorporating diversity and inclusion into the medical school curriculum; recruitment and retention of minorities in medicine; and educating early learners to become patient-centered, culturally competent physicians and leaders in healthcare.



FAFP EXCEPTIONAL RESIDENT SCHOLAR 2021

Joshua Brandon, MD

Since 2006, the FAFP Foundation has presented annual \$1,000 scholarships to outstanding third-year family medicine residents in Florida. The program is merit based, and scholars are chosen by an FAFP Foundation selection committee. This year, FAFP is pleased to award **Joshua Brandon**, **MD**, of Daytona Beach, FL (Halifax Family Medicine Residency) with the Exceptional Resident Scholar designation.

Dr. Brandon was born and raised in Minnesota and attended Winona State University in Southeastern Minnesota, majoring in Cell and Molecular Biology and minoring in Biochemistry. While in undergrad, he began working in the Inclusion and Diversity office at his University, finding passion in working with people of different backgrounds and experiences. He was a leader in Student Senate and was involved in multiple multicultural groups. He worked to charter the first historically African-American fraternity in his school's college system, and invested himself in mentoring young men of color attending high school and college.

He attended the University of Minnesota Medical School. He was elected vice-president of his local SNMA chapter and represented his medical school on a national level as an active member of the Organization of Student Representatives for the AAMC; working as a liaison between them and his school's student council. He also further pursued his interests in Sports Medicine at the University, volunteering for medical staffing at numerous sporting events and activities, and presenting a case poster at the 2019 AMSSM national conference.

Dr. Brandon chose the Halifax Health – Family Medicine Residency Program because of its commitment to inclusion and diversity, working with the underserved, and strong Sports Medicine opportunities and education. With his goal of securing further training in Sports Medicine Fellowship, he knew there was no better place to help him become the best physician he could be. In his spare time, he enjoys spending time with his wife Grace and dog Roy, exploring all that Florida has to offer. He has taken advantage of the warm weather, the many outdoor activities in the area, and the absence of snow!
